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Double-entry bookkeeping The purpose of double-entry bookkeeping is to allow the detection of financial errors and fraud. double-entry accounting, is a method of bookkeeping that relies on a two-sided accounting entry to maintain financial information. The double-entry system has two equal and corresponding sides, known as debit and credit; this is based on the fundamental accounting principle that for every debit, there must be an equal and opposite credit. Every entry into an account requires a corresponding and opposite entry into a different account. A transaction in double-entry bookkeeping always affects at least two accounts, always includes at least one debit and one credit, and always has total debits and total credits that are equal. century The global silver trade between the Americas, Europe, and China from the sixteenth to nineteenth centuries was a spillover of the Columbian exchange which had a profound effect on the world economy. Many scholars consider the silver trade to mark the beginning of a genuinely global economy, with one historian noting that silver "went round the world and made the world go round". "New World mines", concluded several prominent historians, "supported the Spanish empire", acting as a linchpin of the Spanish economy. In addition to the global economic changes the silver trade engendered, it also put into motion a wide array of political transformations in the early modern era.
