The SAT (ess-ay-TEE) is a standardized test widely used for college admissions in the United States. For much of its history, it was called the Scholastic Aptitude Test and had two components, Verbal and Mathematical, each of which was scored on a range from 200 to 800. known as "distractors", exclude questions that a majority of students answer correctly, and impose tight time constraints during the examination. Since its debut in 1926, its name and scoring have changed several times

Tests vary in style, rigor and requirements. There is no general consensus or invariable standard for test formats and difficulty. Often, the format and difficulty of the test is dependent upon the educational philosophy of the instructor, subject matter, class size, policy of the educational institution, and requirements of accreditation or governing bodies.

Under Newton's leadership, the Black Panther Party founded over 60 community support programs (renamed survival programs in 1971) including food banks, medical clinics, sickle cell anemia testing, prison busing for families of inmates, legal advice seminars, clothing banks, housing cooperatives, and their own ambulance service. In the section "How to Read this Book", L. Ron Hubbard describes how he has turned patients into "helpless zombies". As of 2013, the Scientology organization's publishing arm, New Era Publications, sells the book in English and in 50 other languages. Published in 1950, the book launched the movement that Hubbard later characterized as a religion. The book is considered part of Scientology's canon.
