These traits are controlled Triticale (; × Triticosecale) is a hybrid of wheat (Triticum) and rye (Secale) first bred in laboratories during the late 19th century in Scotland and Germany. It is grown mostly for forage or fodder, although some triticale-based foods can be purchased at health food stores and can be found in some breakfast cereals. Depending on the cultivar, triticale can more or less resemble either of its parents. Commercially available triticale is almost always a second-generation hybrid, i. well as traits which are more difficult to improve, such as earlier maturity and improved test weight (a measure of bulk density). , a cross between two kinds of primary (first-cross) triticales. **Sex linkage (dominance).** As human females possess two X-chromosomes and human males possess one X-chromosome and one Y-chromosome, the phenotype of a sex-linked trait can differ between males and females due to the differential number of alleles (polymorphisms) possessed for a given gene. In humans, sex-linked patterns of inheritance are termed X-linked recessive, X-linked dominant and Y-linked. Unlike with X-linked recessive traits, females are more often affected by X-linked dominant traits than males as females have two X-chromosomes Sex linkage describes the sex-specific patterns of inheritance and expression when a gene is present on a sex chromosome (allosome) rather than a non-sex chromosome (autosome). Genes situated on the X-chromosome are thus termed X-linked, and are transmitted by both males and females, while genes situated on the Y-chromosome are termed Y-linked, and are transmitted by males only. **Genetics** Gregor Mendel, a Moravian Augustinian friar working in the 19th century in Brno, was the first to study genetics scientifically. This term, still used today, is a somewhat ambiguous definition of what is referred to as a gene. He observed that organisms (pea plants) inherit traits by way of discrete "units of inheritance". the idea that individuals inherit a smooth blend of traits from their parents. It is an important branch in biology because heredity is vital to organisms' evolution. Mendel studied "trait inheritance", patterns in the way traits are handed down from parents to offspring over time. Mendel's work provided examples where traits were definitely not blended Genetics is the study of genes, genetic variation, and heredity in organisms 103ebe83be

**Balancer chromosome** frozen).
