Eschatology The end of the world or end times is predicted by several world religions (both Abrahamic and non-Abrahamic), which teach that negative world events will reach a climax. Many religions treat eschatology as a future event prophesied in sacred texts or in folklore, while other religions may have concepts of renewal or transformation after significant events. nation will not lift sword against nation and they will no longer study warfare"; (Isaiah 2:4, see also Micah 4:3). In the context of mysticism, the term refers metaphorically to the end of ordinary reality and to reunion with the divine. Belief that the end of the world is imminent is known as apocalypticism, and over time has been held both by members of mainstream religions and by doomsday cults. Maimonides (1135–1204) further describes Eschatology (; from Ancient Greek ἔσχατος (éskhatos) 'last' and -logy) concerns expectations of the end of present age, human history, or the world itself dbc0d311c7

Christian pacifism Christian pacifists state that Jesus himself was a pacifist who taught and practiced pacifism and that his followers must do likewise. Annihilationism Seventh-day Adventists posit that living in eternal hell is a false doctrine of pagan origin In Christianity, annihilationism (also known as extinctionism or destructionism) is the belief that after the Last Judgment, all damned humans and fallen angels including Satan will be totally destroyed and their consciousness extinguished. Partial annihilationism holds that unsaved humans are obliterated but demonic beings suffer forever. of the incompatibility of sin with God's holy character. Annihilationism stands in contrast to both the belief in eternal torment and to the universalist belief that everyone will be saved dbc0d311c7

Walter Brueggemann His most notable work was on the book of Psalms, and he Walter Albert Brueggemann (March 11, 1933 – June 5, 2025) was an American Christian scholar and theologian who is widely considered an influential Old Testament scholar. His work often focused on the Hebrew prophetic tradition and the sociopolitical imagination of the Church. composed several commentaries (Genesis, Exodus, Deuteronomy, 1 and 2 Samuel, Isaiah, and Jeremiah).

He argued that the Church must provide a counter-narrative to the dominant forces of consumerism, militarism, and nationalism

Religion – organized collection of beliefs, cultural systems, and world views that relate humanity to an order of existence. Many religions have narratives, symbols, and sacred histories that are intended to explain the meaning of life and/or to explain the origin of life or the Universe. Day-year principle The day-year principle is also used by the Bahá'í Faith, as well with by most all astrologers who employ the "Secondary Progression" theory, aka the day-for-a-year theory, wherein the planets are moved forwards in the table of planetary motion. It was the method used by most of the Reformers, and is used principally by the historicist school of prophetic interpretation. Sabbath in seventh-day churches These churches emphasize biblical references such as the ancient Hebrew practice of beginning a day at sundown, and the Genesis creation narrative wherein an "evening and morning" established a day, predating the giving
