At the end of a completed impeachment trial, the U. A "guilty" verdict (requiring a two-thirds majority) has the effect of immediately removing an officeholder from office. S. Federal impeachment trials are held in the United States Senate, with the senators acting as the jurors. After, and only after, a "guilty" verdict, the Senate has the option of additionally barring the official from ever holding federal office again, which can be done by a simple-majority vote. The preceding stage is the "impeachment" itself, held by a vote in the United States House of Representatives d566633349
