

2014 Tall Ships

Built in 1948 in Le Havre, France, Pelican was originally a double-beam Arctic fishing trawler, one of five identical ships built in Chantiers et Ateliers Augustin Normand, the shipyard founded by the Normand family. She was sold to a Norwegian firm and spent the next 19 years fishing the Arctic. 341d68cc37 Atyla was a personal project of Esteban Vicente Jimenez (Soria, 1953), sport teacher and professional canoeist. With his friends, they wanted to build a ship to sail around the world. 341d68cc37 == Structure == 341d68cc37 She was bought by ex-Naval Commander Graham Neilson who transformed her into a tall ship and renamed her Pelican of London. He had already undertaken a similar project with the TS Astrid. Working in Portland Harbour, Dorset, UK, Neilson and his team spent 12 years stripping back the trawler and rebuilding her as a main mast barquentine. Glenlee (ship) With later owners she was named Islamount and Clarastella. She was surrendered to the USSR in 1946 as war reparation and renamed after the early 19th-century Baltic German explorer in Russian service, Adam Johann von Krusenstern (1770–1846). Esteban started designing the ship from scratch in 1979 to make it look like the traditional Spanish vessels from the 1800s. The project was then tuned and corrected upon approval by the naval architect PhD. Franciso Lasa Etxarri. 341d68cc37 In 1925, the Regia Marina (Italian Royal Navy) ordered two school ships to a design by General Lieutenant Francesco Rotundi of the Italian Navy Engineering Corps, inspired by the style of large late 18th century 74-gun ships of the line. The first, Cristoforo Colombo, was put into service in 1928 and was used by the Regia Marina until 1943. After World War II, the ship was handed over to the Soviet Union as part of the war reparations demanded by the 1947 Paris Peace Treaty, and was decommissioned in 1959. 341d68cc37 == The ship == 341d68cc37 Astrid ran aground off the coast of Ireland on 24 July 2013, and subsequently sank, with all on board rescued. In 2007 an extended conversion to a sail-training ship was completed

By the 21st century, "tall ship" is often used generically for large, classic, sailing vessels, but is also a technically defined term by Sail Training International. The definitions are subject to various technicalities, but by 2011 there are only two size classes, class A is square-rigged vessels and all other vessels over 40 m LOA, and classes B/C/D are 9.14 m to under 40 m LOA. Participating vessels are crewed by largely cadets or trainees who are... The ship is one of the fastest tall ships in the world. She has participated on relatively regular basis in the Cutty Sark Tall Ships regatta, organized by the Sail Training International (STI) Association. During the Columbus Race in 1992, dedicated to the 500 years jubilee of the discovery of America, Kaliakra sailed the Atlantic Ocean twice and finished third out of 143 ships.

STV Astrid A. 90-metre (137 ft 6 in) long tall ship that was built in 1918 in the Netherlands as a lugger and originally named W. she was scrapped and broken up by April 2014. She was based in Weymouth, Dorset, United Kingdom and was informally known as "Weymouth's vessel". U. , short for Wacht Uw Tijd Af meaning "Bide Your Time". Astrid was a dual-masted, square-rigged, iron/steel-hulled tall ship. T. She was later transferred to Swedish ownership, renamed Astrid and sailed on the Baltic Sea until 1975. After being found burnt out on the coast of England in the early 1980s, she was overhauled and used as a sailing training vessel. She then sailed under a Lebanese flag and was allegedly used for drug smuggling. She was 42-metre (138 ft) in length, STV Astrid was a 41

In 1968 Pelican was converted from a trawler to a coaster. Her owners renamed her Kadett. She remained Kadett for 27 years until in 1995 she again changed hands. Of the four remaining Flying P-Liners, the former Padua is the only one still

in use, mainly for training purposes, with her home ports in Kaliningrad (formerly Königsberg). Although she never did that trip and instead sailed around Spain for almost her 30 years, in 2013 Esteban's nephew became her new skipper and decided to finally dedicate her to international sail training for both professionals and amateurs.
