Grammar-translation method In grammar-translation classes, students learn grammatical rules and then apply those rules by translating sentences between the target language and the native language. The method has two main goals: to enable students to read and translate literature written in the source language, and to further students' general intellectual development. When teachers. The grammar-translation method is a method of teaching foreign languages derived from the classical (sometimes called traditional) method of teaching Ancient Greek and Latin. Advanced students may be required to translate whole texts word-for-word. It originated from the practice of teaching Latin; in the early 16th century, students learned Latin for communication, but after the language died out it was studied purely as an academic discipline

Nouns follow a two-gender system and are marked for number. Verbs are marked for tense, aspect, mood, person, and number (resulting in up to fifty conjugated forms per verb). This approach to language learning was similar to another, earlier method called the direct method. Like the direct method, the audio-lingual method advised that students should be taught a language directly, using the students' native language to explain new words or grammar in target language. However, unlike the direct method, the audio-lingual method did not focus on teaching vocabulary.
