He moved to Caracas in 1947 and studied at the Escuela de Artes Plásticas Aplicadas (Caracas) through 1955; his teachers included Francisco Narváez, Marcos Castillo, Rafael Ramón González, Rafael Monasterios, César Prieto, and Luis Alfredo López Méndez. He also worked at the Taller Libre de Arte in Caracas (1950-1952). Badajoz is a member of the North American Academy of the Spanish Language (ANLE), the editorial board Glosas (ANLE), RANLE (ANLE) and OtroLunes. He has been a member of the boards of Cuadernos de ALDEEU (Spanish Professionals in America), Vitral —recipient of prestigious Prince Claus Award 1999— among others.

History of slavery in New Mexico Slaves of the Spanish included a few of the Pueblos living in the Spanish colony, but most slaves were captured from other Indian tribes in the region. Forced labor and debt peonage were also features of slavery in New Mexico. Española. The enslavement of Indians was common during the Spanish exploration and colonization of New Mexico from 1540 to 1821. In 1542, the Spanish king banned the enslavement of the Indians of the Americas in Spanish colonies, but the ban was mostly ineffective. Slaves were not only valued for their labour, but were also a prestige item among the more prominent and prosperous of the Spanish colonists. The offspring and descendants of enslaved persons were called genizaros and made up one-third of New Mexico's population in the early 19th century. SANM (Spanish Archives of New Mexico) Slavery in New Mexico existed among the Native American (Indian) tribes prior to the arrival of the first Europeans. The name of the language in Zapotec itself varies according to the geographical variant. In Juchitán (Isthmus) it is Diidxazá [didza'za], in Mitla it is Didxsaj [didz'sa^h], in Zoogocho it is Diža'xon [diža^h'zon], in Coatec Zapotec it is Di'zhke' [diʔz'keʔ], in Miahuatec Zapotec it is Dí'zdéh [diʔzdæ] and in Santa Catarina Quioquitani it is Tiits Së [ti'ts sæ], for example.
