Political development in modern Gibraltar During the early days of the British administration, Gibraltar was maintained primarily as a military outpost with limited attention paid to its role as a trading post. century the British considered returning Gibraltar to Spanish rule. Some Governors encouraged the development of the civilian role in government, while others regarded it as a nuisance. Throughout the 19th century there was conflict between the competing roles of military and trading posts, leading to tensions between the civilian population and the Governor of the day. Initially long term settlement of Gibraltar was uncertain but as Spain's power waned it became established as an important base for the British Royal Navy. In addition, several Spanish attempts to retake Gibraltar, most notably during the Gibraltar is a British Overseas Territory located on the southern end of the Iberian Peninsula at the entrance of the Mediterranean Sea.
