Victorian architecture Victorian refers to the reign of Queen Victoria (1837–1901) Victorian architecture is a series of architectural revival styles in the mid-to-late 19th century. The styles often included interpretations and eclectic revivals of historic styles (see historicism). Within this naming and classification scheme, it followed Georgian architecture and later Regency architecture and was succeeded by Edwardian architecture. However, many elements of what is typically termed "Victorian" architecture did not become popular until later in Victoria's reign, roughly from 1850 and later. Victorian architecture is a series of architectural revival styles in the mid-to-late 19th century. Victorian refers to the reign of Queen Victoria (1837–1901), called the Victorian era, during which period the styles known as Victorian were used in construction. Parallel computers can be roughly classified according to the level at which the hardware supports Parallel computing is a type of computation in which many calculations or processes are carried out simultaneously. There are several different forms of parallel computing: bit-level, instruction-level, data, and task parallelism. As power consumption (and consequently heat generation) by computers has become a concern in recent years, parallel computing has become the dominant paradigm in computer architecture, mainly in the form of multi-core processors. Large problems can often be divided into smaller ones, which can then be solved at the same time 6bab732ba7

A system architecture can consist of system components and the sub-systems developed, that will work together to implement the overall system. There have been efforts to formalize languages to describe system architecture, collectively these are called architecture description languages (ADLs). 6bab732ba7

Gothic Revival architecture Gothic Revival draws upon features of medieval examples, including decorative patterns, finials, lancet windows, and hood moulds. is an architectural movement that after a gradual build-up beginning in the second half of the 17th century became a widespread movement in the first Gothic Revival (also referred to as Victorian Gothic or neo-Gothic) is an architectural movement that after a gradual build-up beginning in the second half of the 17th century became a widespread movement in the first half of the 19th century, mostly in England. By the middle of the 19th century, Gothic Revival had become the pre-eminent architectural style in the Western world, only to begin to fall out of fashion in the 1880s and early 1890s. Increasingly serious and learned admirers sought to revive medieval Gothic architecture, intending to complement or even supersede the neoclassical styles prevalent at the time 6bab732ba7
