Members saw themselves as organized criminals; gangs were formal-rational organizations, Strong Organized crime refers to transnational, national, or local groups of centralized enterprises that engage in illegal activities, most commonly for profit. These groups may adopt tactics similar to those used by authoritarian regimes to maintain power.
