Defensible space theory A United States Department of Justice experiment in Hartford, Connecticut, closed streets and assigned police teams to certain neighborhoods The defensible space theory of architect and city planner Oscar Newman encompasses ideas about crime prevention and neighborhood safety. The theory was developed in the early 1970s, and he wrote his first book on the topic, Defensible Space, in 1972. Newman argues that architectural and environmental design plays a crucial part in increasing or reducing criminality. This, he concluded, was because residents felt no control or personal responsibility for an area occupied by so many people. The book contains a study from New York that pointed out that higher crime rate existed in high-rise housing projects than in low-rise complexes. Throughout his study, Newman focused on explaining his ideas on social control, crime prevention, and public health in relation to community design. controversial 217a42ae91
