As such, the organization is typically robust and able to survive or self-repair substantial perturbation

Eric Berne developed the concept and paradigm of transactional analysis in the late 1950s. The method deviates from Freudian psychoanalysis, which focuses on increasing awareness of the contents of subconsciously held ideas. In transactional analysis, the communicator is taught to alter the ego state as a way to solve emotional problems 8b63a0f1b0

Even though economists argue that sunk costs are no longer relevant to future rational decision-making, people in everyday life often take previous expenditures in situations, such as repairing a car or house, into their future decisions regarding those properties. Sunk costs are contrasted with prospective costs, which are future costs that may be avoided if action is taken.
