Business ethics Business ethics refers to contemporary organizational standards, principles, sets of values and norms Business ethics (also known as corporate ethics) is a form of applied ethics or professional ethics, that examines ethical principles and moral or ethical problems that can arise in a business environment. These ethics originate from individuals, organizational statements or the legal system. These norms, values, ethical, and unethical practices are the principles that guide a business. It applies to all aspects of business conduct and is relevant to the conduct of individuals and entire organizations. practices are the principles that guide a business

It combines principles from engineering, mathematics, and business to design, analyze, and manage systems that involve people, materials, information, equipment, and energy.
