Albert Strickler He applied these concepts to the development of a dimensionally homogeneous form of the Manning formula. Strickler proposed that hydraulic roughness could be characterized as a function of measurable surface roughness and described the concept of relative roughness, the ratio of hydraulic radius to surface roughness. Stress (mechanics) Stress has dimension of force per area, with SI units of newtons per square meter (N/m²) or pascal (Pa). An object being pushed together, such as a crumpled sponge, is subject to compressive stress and may undergo shortening. For example, an object being pulled apart, such as a stretched elastic band, is subject to tensile stress and may undergo elongation. The greater the force and the smaller the cross-sectional area of the body on which it acts, the
