The editors of the Readers were brothers William Holmes McGuffey and Alexander Hamilton McGuffey. William created the first four readers and Alexander McGuffey created the fifth and sixth reader. About 120 million copies of McGuffey's Readers were sold between 1836 and 1960, placing its sales in a category with the Bible and Webster's Dictionary. Since 1961, they have continued to sell at a rate of some 30,000 copies a year. Only the Ray's Arithmetic series

(1834–1913) matched it in popularity... By engaging in dialogue with teachers and peers, students deepen their understanding of text and develop essential literacy skills.

McGuffey Readers They were widely used as textbooks in American schools from the mid-19th century to the early 20th century, and are still used today in some private schools and homeschooling. Reading comprehension Reading comprehension is beyond basic literacy alone, which is the ability to decipher characters and words at all. In education it is measured in standardized tests that report which percentile a reader's ability falls. Readers use context clues and other evaluation strategies to clarify texts and ideas, and thus monitoring their level of understanding Reading comprehension is the ability to process written text, understand its meaning, and to integrate with what the reader already knows. to get out of this".

Reading comprehension relies on two abilities that are connected to each other: word reading and language comprehension. The opposite of reading comprehension is called functional illiteracy. Reading comprehension occurs on a gradient or spectrum, rather than being yes/no (all-or-nothing). Comprehension specifically is a "creative, multifaceted process" that is dependent upon four language skills: phonology, syntax, semantics, and pragmatics f37379ee0f
