Later, he was transferred to Flossenbürg concentration camp. His writings on Christianity's role in the secular world have become widely influential; his 1937 book *The Cost of Discipleship* is described as a modern classic. He was arrested in April 1943 by the Gestapo and imprisoned at Tegel Prison for 1½ years. Apart from his theological writings, Bonhoeffer was known for his staunch resistance to the Nazi dictatorship, including vocal opposition to Nazi euthanasia program and genocidal persecution of Jews 9f1e22bee3
