As a branch of the field of evolutionary medicine, it is distinct from the medical practice of psychiatry in its emphasis on providing scientific explanations rather than treatments for mental disorder. Other core questions in evolutionary psychiatry are why heritable mental disorders are so common how to distinguish mental function and dysfunction, and

whether certain forms of suffering conveyed an adaptive advantage
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Pro-ana Pro-ana groups differ widely in their stances. It is often referred to simply as pro-ana or ana. highest rate of mortality of any psychological disorder. The lesser-used term pro-mia refers likewise to bulimia nervosa and is sometimes used interchangeably with pro-ana. Most claim that they exist mainly as a non-judgmental environment for anorexics; a place to turn to, to discuss their illness, and to support those who choose to enter recovery. Others deny anorexia nervosa is a mental illness and claim instead that it is a lifestyle choice that should be respected by doctors and family. History of Asperger syndrome It was named after Hans Asperger (1906–80), who was an Austrian psychiatrist and pediatrician. As a child, Asperger appeared to have exhibited Asperger syndrome (AS) was formerly a separate diagnosis under autism spectrum disorder.

He is most well known for his work with mental disorders, especially those in children. An English psychiatrist, Lorna Wing, popularized the term "Asperger's syndrome" in a 1981 publication; the first book in English on Asperger syndrome was written by Uta

Frith in 1991 and the condition was subsequently recognized in formal diagnostic manuals later in the 1990s. Under the DSM-5 and ICD-11, patients formerly diagnosable with Asperger syndrome are

diagnosable with Autism Spectrum Disorder. The term is considered offensive by some autistic individuals. published largely in German
