Tuskegee Airmen Davis Jr. On February 6, 2014, a 17-mile section of I-80 between Vacaville, CA and Davis, CA, near Travis Air Force Base, was named the "Tuskegee Airman Memorial The Tuskegee Airmen were a group of primarily African-American military pilots (fighter and bomber) and airmen who fought in World War II. The Tuskegee Airmen received praise for their excellent combat record earned while protecting American bombers from enemy fighters. The name also applies to the navigators, bombardiers, mechanics, instructors, crew chiefs, nurses, cooks, and other support personnel. The group was awarded three Distinguished Unit Citations. They formed the 332nd Fighter Group and the 477th Bombardment Group (Medium) of the United States Army Air Forces (USAAF)
