Initially, it held a connotation of low magic, implying fraudulent or deceptive mageia as opposed to theurgy, which was regarded as divine magic. The term "goetia" finds its origins in the Greek word "goes", which originally denoted diviners, magicians, healers, and seers. Grimoires, also known as "books of spells" or "spellbooks", serve as instructional manuals for various magical endeavors.
