Islamic views on slavery Any person whose Islamic views on slavery represent a complex and multifaceted body of Islamic thought, with various Islamic groups or thinkers espousing views on the matter which have been radically different throughout history. was free under the dictum of The basic principle is liberty (Arabic: al-ʾaṣl huwa l-ḥurriya), and slavery was an exceptional condition. Slavery was a mainstay of life in pre-Islamic Arabia and surrounding lands. The Quran and the hadith (sayings of Muhammad) address slavery extensively, assuming its existence as part of society but viewing it as an exceptional condition and restricting its scope. Early Islam forbade enslavement of dhimmis, the free members of Islamic society, including non-Muslims and set out to regulate and improve the conditions of human bondage. Islamic law regarded as legal slaves only those non-Muslims who were imprisoned or bought beyond the borders of Islamic rule, or the sons and daughters

Deaf education This may involve, but does not always, individually-planned, systematically-monitored teaching methods, adaptive materials, accessible settings, and other interventions designed to help students achieve a higher level of self-sufficiency and success in the school and community than they would achieve with a typical classroom education. program, deaf children learn sign language such as American Sign Language (ASL) as a first language, followed by a written or spoken language such as English Deaf education is the education of students with any degree of hearing loss or deafness. A number of countries focus on training teachers to teach deaf students with a variety of approaches and have organizations to support and advocate for deaf students. List of children's books featuring deaf characters Despite approximately one third of people over 65 years of age being affected by disabling hearing loss Deaf adult characters are significantly underrepresented in children's books; even within books which do include a Deaf character. In more recent times society has improved attitudes towards deaf. editions without fingerspelling on the cover and American editions with ASL fingerspelling illustrations on the front covers. There have been several studies into how Deaf children are portrayed in children's literature.
