

100 Case Studies In Pathophysiology

Triptans selectively bind to the 5-HT_{1F} receptor subtype. A number of triptans have been shown to act on this subtype as well, but only after their affinity for 5-HT_{1B} and 5-HT_{1D} has been made responsible for their anti-migraine activity. The lack of affinity for these receptors might result in fewer side effects related to vasoconstriction compared to triptans in susceptible patients, such as those with ischemic heart disease, Raynaud's phenomenon or after a myocardial infarction. A 1998 review has found such side effects to rarely occur in most patients taking triptans. 53ec75b195 Those who have ocular rosacea may be treated with warm compresses, artificial tears and washing the area around the eye with warm water, including the eyelids, to help relieve symptoms. Additionally, oral antibiotics, typically doxycycline, may be prescribed. Hypnic headache They typically begin a few hours after sleep begins and can last from 15–180 min. There is normally no nausea, photophobia, phonophobia or autonomic symptoms associated with the headache. They are moderate, throbbing, bilateral or unilateral headaches that wake the sufferer from sleep once or multiple times a night. Pathophysiology of nerve entrapment The injury will often be a mixed lesion where mild/moderate compression is a combination of a metabolic block and neuropraxia, while severe compression combines elements of neuropraxia and axonmetesis. The magnitude and duration of the forces determines the extent of injury. The pathophysiology of entrapment is complex Nerve entrapment involves a cascade of physiological changes caused by compression and tension. within the nerve itself. In the acute form, mechanical injury and metabolic blocks impede nerve function. Some of these changes are irreversible. In deep gluteal syndrome, scar tissue is the most common cause of sciatic nerve entrapment. In the chronic form, there is a sequence of changes starting with a breakdown of the blood-nerve-barrier, followed by edema with connective tissue changes, followed by diffuse demyelination, and finally followed by axonmetesis 53ec75b195

Becker's nevus This form of nevus was first documented in 1948 by American dermatologist Samuel William Becker (1894–1964). Thus the pathophysiology of Becker's nevus remains unclear. less aesthetic nature of the effects of the skin disorder. The nevus can be present at birth, but more often shows up around puberty. While it is generally considered Becker's nevus (also known as "Becker's melanosis", "Becker's pigmentary hamartoma", "nevus melanosis", and "pigmented hairy epidermal nevus") is a benign skin disorder predominantly affecting males. The nevus is due to an overgrowth of the epidermis, pigment cells (melanocytes), and hair follicles. It generally first appears as an irregular pigmentation (melanosis or hyperpigmentation) on the torso or upper arm (though other areas of the body can be

affected), and gradually enlarges irregularly, becoming thickened and often hairy (hypertrichosis) 53ec75b195

SUNCT syndrome As diagnostic criteria have been indecisive and its pathophysiology remains Short-lasting unilateral neuralgiform headache with conjunctival injection and tearing (SUNCT syndrome) is a rare headache disorder that belongs to the group of headaches called trigeminal autonomic cephalalgia (TAC). SUNCT in such cases can be removed permanently with endoscopic sinus surgery. Symptoms include excruciating burning, stabbing, or electrical headaches mainly near the eye and typically these sensations are only on one side of the body. Each attack can last from five seconds to six minutes and may occur up to 200 times daily. The headache attacks are typically accompanied by cranial autonomic signs that are unique to SUNCT 53ec75b195

Perinatal asphyxia Perinatal asphyxia (also known as neonatal asphyxia or birth asphyxia) is the medical condition resulting from deprivation of oxygen to a newborn infant that lasts long enough during the birth process to cause physical harm, usually to the brain. It remains a serious condition which causes significant mortality and morbidity. It is also an insult to the fetus or newborn due to lack of oxygen or lack of perfusion to various organs and may be associated with a lack of ventilation. Perinatal asphyxia is also an oxygen deficit from the 28th week of gestation to the first seven days following delivery. Basically, understanding of the etiology of perinatal asphyxia provides the platform on which to build on its pathophysiology. in modern obstetrics. It is also the inability to establish and sustain adequate or spontaneous respiration upon delivery of the newborn, an emergency condition that requires adequate and quick resuscitation measures 53ec75b195
