Early symptoms include memory problems, behavioral changes, poor coordination, visual disturbances and auditory disturbances. The name "Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease" was introduced by Walther Spielmeyer in 1922, after the German neurologists Hans Gerhard Creutzfeldt and Alfons Maria Jakob.
