Insects have a chitinous exoskeleton, a three-part body (head, thorax and abdomen), three pairs of jointed legs, compound eyes, and a pair of antennae 847abc1d17

The insect nervous system consists of a brain and a ventral nerve cord. Most insects reproduce by laying eggs. Insects breathe air through a system of paired openings along their sides, connected to small tubes that take air directly to the tissues. The blood therefore does not carry oxygen; it is only partly contained in vessels, and some circulates in an open hemocoel... 847abc1d17

Arthropod They possess an exoskeleton with a cuticle made of chitin, often mineralised with

calcium carbonate, a body with differentiated (metameric) segments, and paired jointed appendages. They form an extremely diverse group of up to ten million species. The stem-group arthropods, have been suggested to be Mandibulates in some recent studies. The Hymenocarina, a group of bivalved arthropods, previously thought Arthropods (AR-thrə-pod) are invertebrates in the phylum Arthropoda. In order to keep growing, they must go through stages of moulting, a process by which they shed their exoskeleton to reveal a new one

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Cyborg D A cyborg (, a portmanteau of cybernetic and organism) is a being with both organic and biomechatronic body parts. A related idea is the "augmented human";. Kline. While cyborgs are commonly thought of as mammals, including humans, the term can apply to any organism.

The term was coined in 1960 by Manfred Clynes and Nathan S. intelligence. In contrast to biorobots and androids, the term cyborg applies to a living organism that has restored function or enhanced abilities due to the integration of some artificial component or technology that relies on feedback 847abc1d17

Several groups of modern species are habitual bipeds whose normal method of locomotion is two-legged. In the Triassic period some groups of archosaurs (a group that includes crocodiles and dinosaurs) developed bipedalism; among the dinosaurs, all the early forms and many later groups were habitual or exclusive bipeds; the birds are members of a clade of exclusively bipedal dinosaurs, the theropods. 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Bipedalism Types of bipedal movement include walking or running (a bipedal gait) and hopping. An animal or machine that usually moves in a bipedal manner is known as a biped , meaning 'two feet' (from Latin bis 'double' and pes 'foot'). macropods, kangaroo rats and mice, springhare, hopping mice, pangolins and hominin apes (australopithecines, including humans) as well as various other Bipedalism is a form of terrestrial locomotion where an animal moves by means of its two rear (or lower) limbs or legs

Several aspects of ornithology differ from related disciplines, due partly to the high visibility and the aesthetic appeal of birds.
