Dysfunctional family Children that grow up in such families may think such a situation is normal. Parents having grown up in a dysfunctional family may over-correct or emulate their own parents. In some cases, the dominant parent will abuse or neglect their children and the other parent will not object, misleading a child to assume blame. Dysfunctional families are primarily a result of two adults, one typically overtly abusive and the other codependent, and may also be affected by substance abuse or other forms of addiction, or often by an untreated mental illness. Disagreements about nature and nurture (parents, often non-biological, blame common problems on child's heredity, when faulty parenting may be the actual cause A dysfunctional family is a family in which conflict, misbehavior and often child neglect or abuse on the part of individual parents occur continuously and regularly

Employee motivation Pierce, Cameron, Banko, and So conducted a study to examine how extrinsic rewards affect people's intrinsic motivation when the rewards are based on increasingly Employee motivation is an intrinsic and internal drive to put forth the necessary effort and action towards work-related activities. " Motivated employees are essential to the success of an organization as motivated employees are generally more productive at the work place. Motivation at work has been defined as 'the sum of the processes that influence the arousal, direction, and maintenance of behaviors relevant to work settings'. Also, "Motivation can be thought of as the willingness to expend energy to achieve a goal or a reward. It has been broadly defined as the "psychological forces that determine the direction of a person's behavior in an organisation, a person's level of effort and a person's level of persistence"

These commandments were enforced as law in many jurisdictions, and are still considered enforceable law by some. Exodus 20:1 describes the Ten Commandments as being spoken by Yahweh, inscribed on two stone tablets by the finger of God, broken by Moses, and rewritten on replacement stones by the Lord. The most common caretakers in parenting are the biological parents of the child in question. However, a caretaker may be an older sibling, step-parent, grandparent, legal guardian, aunt, uncle, other family members, or a family friend. Governments and society may also have a role in child-rearing or upbringing. In many cases, orphaned or abandoned children receive parental care from non-parent or non-blood relations. Others may be adopted, raised in foster care, or placed in an orphanage.

Reinforcement appetitive behavior such as subjective "wanting" and "liking" (desire and pleasure) function as rewards or positive reinforcement. There is also negative In behavioral psychology, reinforcement refers to consequences that increase the likelihood of an organism's future behavior, typically in the presence of a particular antecedent stimulus. Punishment is the inverse

to reinforcement, referring to any behavior that decreases the likelihood that. For example, a rat can be trained to push a lever to receive food whenever a light is turned on; in this example, the light is the antecedent stimulus, the lever pushing is the operant behavior, and the food is the reinforcer. Likewise, a student that receives attention and praise when answering a teacher's question will be more likely to answer future questions in class; the teacher's question is the antecedent, the student's response is the behavior, and the praise and attention are the reinforcements dd283af2c2

Child discipline The word discipline is defined as imparting knowledge and skill, in other words, to teach. "There is advice against time-outs or praise and rewards, when in fact Child discipline is the methods used to prevent future unwanted behaviour in children. To discipline means to instruct a person to follow a particular code of conduct. In its most general sense, discipline refers to systematic instruction given to a disciple. the internet and in parenting books is limited and often inaccurate and misleading dd283af2c2

Parenting Parenting refers to the intricacies of raising a child and not exclusively for a biological relationship. "correct parenting style for raising a child, since parenting styles can affect children differently depending on their circumstances and temperament Parenting or child rearing promotes and supports the physical, cognitive, social, emotional, and educational development from infancy to adulthood dd283af2c2

Insufficient justification Insufficient justification occurs when the threat or reward is actually. The theory of insufficient justification formally states that when extrinsic motivation is low, people are motivated to reduce cognitive dissonance by generating an intrinsic motivation to explain their behavior, and similarly more likely to decline a desired activity when presented with a mild threat versus a more serious threat. The larger reward minimizes the cognitive dissonance generated by acting in contradiction to one's beliefs because it feels easier to justify. In another study, research was done within the workplace environment in terms of jobs and the subsequent rewards given to them to motivate Insufficient justification is an effect studied in the discipline of social psychology. It states that people are more likely to engage in a behavior that contradicts the beliefs they hold personally when offered a smaller reward compared to a larger reward. adults as well dd283af2c2
