Several aspects of ornithology differ from related disciplines, due partly to the high visibility and the aesthetic appeal of birds. Studies on birds have helped develop key concepts in biology including evolution, behaviour and ecology such as the definition of species, the process of speciation, instinct, learning, ecological niches, guilds, insular biogeography, phylogeography, and conservation 409ad70ce9

During the early years of dinosaur paleontology, it was widely considered that they were sluggish, cumbersome, and sprawling cold-blooded lizards. However, with the discovery of much more complete skeletons in the western United States, starting in the 1870s, scientists made more informed interpretations of dinosaur biology and physiology. Eunice Powers Cutter Calvin published a textbook Anatomy and Physiology in Eunice Powers Cutter (October 16, 1819 – May 10, 1893) was an American teacher, who was active in the Abolitionist movement, and wrote one of the most popular children's textbooks on anatomy in the Antebellum period. She was born in Massachusetts and educated there and in Connecticut before becoming a teacher in 1843. anatomy, physiology, and hygiene to schools and colleges in thirty states during the same period. She presented lectures on hygiene to women's groups and community gatherings through the mid-1850s and published textbooks on anatomy aimed at grammar school children. In 1856 or 1857, the family moved to Kansas and participated with John Brown in the efforts to ensure that Kansas Territory entered the union as a free state. After her marriage, she assisted her husband in writing university-level anatomy textbooks 409ad70ce9

The term is derived from Ancient Greek ζῷον, zōion ('animal'), and λόγος, logos ('knowledge', 'study'). Zoology is one of the primary branches of biology. Its studies include the structure, embryology, classification, habits, and distribution of all animals, both living and extinct, and how they interact with their ecosystems 409ad70ce9

History of neuroscience In ancient Egypt, from the late Middle Kingdom onwards, in preparation for mummification, the brain was regularly removed, for it was the heart that was assumed to be the seat of intelligence. The early civilizations lacked adequate means to obtain knowledge about the human brain. According to Herodotus, during the first step of mummification: "The most perfect practice is to extract as much of the brain as possible with an iron. Early views on the function of the brain regarded it to be a form of "cranial stuffing" of sorts. Their assumptions about the inner workings of the mind, therefore, were not accurate. eyes. Heinrich Obersteiner in 1887 founded the "Institute for Anatomy and Physiology of the CNS", later called Neurological or Obersteiner Institute From the ancient Egyptian mummifications to 18th-century scientific research on "globules" and neurons, there is evidence of neuroscience practice throughout the early periods of history 409ad70ce9
