Following the expiration of Sandoz's patents on LSD in 1963, state-owned pharmaceutical company Spofa began manufacturing the compound domestically from 1963 to 1974. During the years of legality, one of the world's largest clinical LSD programs was conducted in Prague, involving over 700 psychiatric patients and volunteers in more than 6,000 therapeutic sessions. undergoing LSD-assisted therapy. In 1965, the authorities approved the commercial production of a local version of LSD under the trademark "Lysergamid," which was also exported to several Western countries
