Death of Mark Saunders Around 20 minutes after the previous round of shooting, just after 21:30, Saunders. When armed police officers arrived, Saunders fired at their vehicle and the siege began. Neighbours called the police after Saunders repeatedly fired a shotgun from a window shortly before 17:00 (BST, UTC+1). More armed officers arrived and took up positions in surrounding buildings and on the street. Saunders fired on two more occasions and the police returned fire, slightly wounding him. judge expressed concern about the practice of officers conferring. Saunders was a successful divorce lawyer who struggled with depression and alcoholism. A year after the shooting, in May 2009, the IPCC announced that its investigation was Mark Saunders was a British barrister who was shot dead by police on 6 May 2008 after a five-hour siege at his home in Markham Square in Chelsea, London.
