Organized crime Many criminal organizations rely on fear or terror to achieve their goals and maintain control within their ranks. Some forms of organized crime exist simply to meet demand for illegal goods or to facilitate trade in products and services banned by the state, such as illegal drugs or firearms. While organized crime is generally considered a form of illegal business, some criminal organizations, such as terrorist groups, rebel groups, and separatists, are politically motivated. In other cases, criminal organizations force people to do business. S. Department of Justice journal stated that: Organized crime refers to transnational, national, or local groups of centralized enterprises that engage in illegal activities, most commonly for profit. These groups may adopt tactics
