S2CID 3013869. Later, with additional public funding and also with private industry partnerships, the network developed into a major part of the Internet backbone. It was created to link researchers to the NSF-funded supercomputing centers. The program created several nationwide backbone computer networks in support of these initiatives fe0bc1beca

Science education in England Below university level, science education is the responsibility of three bodies: the Department for Education, Ofqual and the QAA, but at university level, science education is regulated by various professional bodies, and the Bologna Process via the QAA. in the 2010s, single science has effectively been removed from most GCSE specifications, and the two components of double science have been combined to Science education in England is generally regulated at all levels for assessments that are England's, from 'primary' to 'tertiary' (university). Ofqual on the other hand, regulates science education for GCSEs and AS/A levels, as well as all other qualifications, except those covered by the QAA, also via qualification boards. 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International Network Working Group Set up in 1972 as an informal group to consider the technical issues involved in connecting different networks, its goal was to develop an international standard protocol for internetworking. INWG became a subcommittee of the International Federation for Information Processing (IFIP) the following year. Concepts developed by members of the group contributed to the Protocol for Packet Network Intercommunication proposed by Vint Cerf and Bob Kahn in 1974 and the Transmission Control Protocol and Internet Protocol (TCP/IP) that emerged later.
