It was marketed under various nameplates worldwide – including the Transporter or Caravelle in Europe and Australia, (Misnamed T25 in some parts of the UK), Microbus and Kombi in South Africa, Kampeerauto in Netherlands, Combi in France and Vanagon in North and South America

The vehicle used the chassis of the Renault Trafic commercial van. Though Renault did not sell the model line itself in North America, the Trafic shared its gasoline and diesel engines with several Renault and Jeep vehicles marketed in the United States (at the time, Renault was the parent company of AMC/Jeep). Less than half the weight of a Class C RV based on an American-produced chassis, the LeSharo offered fuel economy from 16 to 23 MPG, dependent on powertrain. It was larger, heavier, and more angular in its styling than its T2 predecessor, but shared the same rear-engine, cab-over design. It was produced in a rear wheel drive version as well as a 4WD version marketed as "Syncro."
