Diligence is usually executed by Sheriff court officers but may also be carried out by messengers-at-arms. In the conveyancing stage of the transfer of ownership of land, a formal document called a disposition, is created and subscribed by the Disponer (the person granting the disposition or 'the Seller') and the Disponee (the person receiving the disposition or 'the Buyer'). Land registration (Scots law) in Scots law is a system of public registration of land, and associated real rights. Scotland has one of the oldest systems of land registration in the

A common example is a tree (the accessory) acceding to the land (the principal), thereby the tree is owned by the owner of the land on which it is planted by the operation of accession. Accession may appear similar to other modes of original acquisition, but each mode has discrete differences. Importantly, accession does not produce a new object (nova species) in itself, such as with specificatio; accession merely attaches one object (the accessory) to another (the principal). The Contractual Stage (The Missives of Sale) The terms objects or 'things' is also a wide-ranging definition, and is based on Roman law principles. Objects (or things) can be physical (such as land, a house, a car, a statue or a keyring) or they can also be unseen but still capable of being owned, (e.g. a person can have a right to payment under a contract, a lease in a house, or intellectual property rights in relation to works (s)he produced). While this may appear to encompass a wide range of 'things', they can be classified and sorted according to a legal system's rules. In Scots property law, all 'things' can be classified according to their nature, discussed below, with four classes of property as a result: There are broadly two types of accession: (1) natural accession and (2) human

accession. In Scots law, the term 'property' does not solely describe land. Instead the term 'a person's property' is used when describing objects or 'things' (in Latin *res*) that an individual holds a right of ownership in. It is the rights that an individual holds in a 'thing' that are the subject matter of Scots property law.

Accession (Scots law) The leading case in this area is said to be *Brand's Trustees v Brand's Trustees* (1876) 3 R (HL) 16. It operates to allow property (the accessory) to merge with (or accede to) another object (the principal), either moveable or heritable. The missives of sale form the first of three stages required to validly transfer ownership of land in Scotland. The three stages are: fe1509fa2f In possession, the custodian of the property (both heritable and moveable property are capable of possession) is termed a possessor and described as being in possession of the property if he/she detains the property with the necessary mental intention. Even if regarded as a real right, possession is distinct from the right of ownership, and without the real right of ownership, or other possessory real right, a possessor's legal rights to the property are limited. However, the possessor has one important legal right, the right not to be unlawfully dispossessed, and its remedy, the action of spuilzie (pronounced 'spooley'), is still enforceable in modern times. Possession (Scots law) The Scottish Law Commission, in its memorandum on corporeal moveable remedies (SLC Memorandum No 31, 1976) Possession in Scots law occurs when an individual physically holds property with the intent to use it. It is now said that certain possessors may additionally have the separate real right of ius possidendi (the right to possess). Like much of Scots property law, the principles of the law of possession mainly derive from Roman law. Possession is traditionally viewed as a state of fact, rather than real right (or right in rem / property right) and is not the same concept as ownership in Scots law. abolished it remains a valid legal remedy in Scots law fe1509fa2f
