Development began in 2011, with Kim Eun-sook's script later adapted from Kim Won-seok's original manuscript, *Doctors Without Borders*. Pre-production involved location scouting and a crew of over 350 personnel. Directed by Lee Eung-bok and Baek Sang-hoon, filming took place in South Korea and Greece with a budget of ₩13 billion. The series was fully pre-produced prior to broadcast, a departure from the live-shoot production method standard in the Korean industry at the time.
