Timeboxing is used as a project planning technique. The schedule is divided into a number of separate time periods (timeboxes), with each part having its own deliverables, deadline and budget.

Sometimes referred to as schedule as independent variable (SAIV).

"Timeboxing works best in multistage projects or tasks that take little time and you can fit them in the same time slot. It is also worth implementing in case of duties that have foreseeable time-frames of completion." 47eca9e2fc Software architecture is about making fundamental structural choices that are costly to change once implemented. Software architecture choices include specific structural options from possibilities in the design of the software.

== History / Research == 47eca9e2fc The expression "lean software development" originated in a book by the same name, written by Mary Poppendieck and Tom Poppendieck in 2003. The book restates traditional lean principles, as well as a set of 22 tools and compares the tools to corresponding agile practices. The Poppendiecks' involvement in the agile software development community, including talks at several Agile conferences has resulted in such concepts being more widely accepted within the agile community. 47eca9e2fc The increasing globalization with the aid of novel capabilities provided by the technological efficacy of the Internet has led software development companies to offshore

their development efforts to more economically attractive areas. This phenomenon began in the 90s, while its strategic importance was realized in the 2000s. Most initial related studies also date from around this time. Waterman, Nobel, and Allan (2015) explored the tensions between spending too little time designing an up-front architecture, increasing risk, and spending too much time, negatively impacting the delivery of value to the customer. They identify six forces that can affect agile architecture: Requirements instability, technical risk, early value, team culture, customer agility and experience. These forces may be addressed by six strategies: Respond to change, address risk, emergent architecture, big design up front and use frameworks and template architectures. The details of the process used for a development effort vary. The process may be confined to a formal, documented

standard, or it can be customized and emergent for the development effort. V-model (software development) The V-Model demonstrates the relationships between each phase of the development life cycle

and its associated phase of testing. The horizontal and vertical axes represent time or project completeness (left-to-right) and level of abstraction (coarsest-grain abstraction uppermost), respectively. Instead of moving down linearly, the process steps are bent upwards after the coding phase, to form the typical V shape. The V-Model has been criticized by Agile advocates and others as an inadequate model of software development for numerous In software development, the V-model represents a development process that may be considered an extension of the waterfall model and is an example of the more general V-model. is ready for use in real-time 47eca9e2fc

According to Cutter Senior Consultant Bhuvan Unhelkar, "DAD provides a carefully constructed mechanism that not only streamlines IT work, but more importantly, enables scaling." Paul Gorans and Philippe Kruchten call for more discipline in implementation of agile approaches and indicate that DAD, as an example framework, is "a hybrid agile approach to enterprise IT solution delivery that provides a solid foundation from which to scale." 47eca9e2fc

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
