Such sequences are chronologically ordered unlike words or DNA

sequences for example. social sciences strongly differ from those of sequence analysis in bioinformatics. Analyzed sequences are encoded representations of, for example, individual life trajectories such as family formation, school to work transitions, working careers, but they may also describe daily or weekly time use or represent the evolution of observed or self-reported health, of political behaviors, or the development stages of organizations

Data Data may represent abstract ideas or concrete measurements. A datum is an individual value in a collection of data. Data may be used as variables in a computational process. Data are usually organized into structures such as tables that provide additional context and meaning, and may themselves be used as data in larger structures.
