Lucid dreams are also a distinct state from other lucid boundary sleep states such as lucid. Oneiroid syndrome This condition can manifest as catatonic stupor with clear consciousness (lucid catatonia) or with altered consciousness (oneiroid catatonia) Oneiroid syndrome (OS) is a psychiatric condition marked by dream-like disturbances of consciousness. symptoms. The term originates from the Ancient Greek words "ὄνειρος" (óneiros, meaning "dream") and "εἶδος" (eîdos, meaning "form" or "likeness"), translating to "dream-like" or "oneiric" (occasionally described as "nightmare-like").
