They were thought to possess extraordinary powers and were often envisioned as being of tremendous physical size. They were also sometimes depicted wearing clothes with elaborate decorative. Both the Sumerian and Akkadian languages contain many words to express the sensation of ni, including the word puluhtu, meaning "fear". The deities typically wore melam, an ambiguous substance which "covered them in terrifying splendor" and which could also be worn by heroes, kings, giants, and even demons. Deities in ancient Mesopotamia were almost exclusively anthropomorphic. The effect that seeing a deity's melam has on a human is described as ni, a word for the "physical creeping of the flesh"

Pre-Roman Celtic art produced few images of deities, and these are hard to identify, lacking inscriptions, but in the post-conquest period many more images were made, some with inscriptions.
