

Skeleton Key Alex Rider Book 3

Horowitz came up with the idea for the series when he thought about creating a teenage equivalent of James Bond. In 2003 the novel was listed on the BBC's survey The Big Read. In 2007, it was adapted into a graphic novel, written by Antony Johnston and illustrated by Kanako Damerum and Yuzuru Takasaki, and in 2020 served as the basis of the first season of the Amazon Prime Video series Alex Rider, starring Otto Farrant as Rider.

Plot summary

Johnston started his career as a graphic designer. He began his writing career with work for role-playing magazines, then used his graphic design skills to design graphic novels. American electronics billionaire Michael J. Roscoe is killed in his New York City office by a reputable contract killer. Elsewhere, a man known as "Skoda" sells drugs to Alex Rider's classmates. After noticing this, Alex follows Skoda to his home, situated on a barge on the River Thames at Putney, but is caught by the police after using a crane to lift the barge out of the water. He accidentally drops it in a police conference centre rather than a nearby car park, as he originally intended, thanks to the builders shutting down the crane's power. The police arrest Skoda and his accomplice, Mike Beckett.

His fiction debut, *Frightening Curves*, was an illustrated horror novel with artwork by Aman Chaudhary, published by Cyberosia Publishing in 2001. The book won the Best Horror Award in the 2002 IPPY awards at Book Expo America...

The books *Point Blanc*, *Eagle Strike*, and *Scorpia* books were adapted into a TV series in 2020, 2021, and 2024, respectively, starring Otto Farrant. Walker Books published the first novels in the United Kingdom alongside Puffin in the United States. More recent entries in the series were published by Philomel Books, an imprint of Penguin Books.
