Aspergillus was first catalogued in 1729 by the Italian priest and biologist Pier Antonio Micheli. Viewing the fungi under a microscope, Micheli was reminded of the shape of an aspergillum (holy water sprinkler), from Latin *spargere* (to sprinkle), and named the genus accordingly. *Aspergillum* is an asexual spore-forming structure common to all *Aspergillus* species; around one-third of species are also known to have a sexual stage. While some species of *Aspergillus* are known to cause fungal infections, others are of commercial importance. c6cc463204
