Metacognition memory accuracy and risk choice in two rhesus monkeys. There are generally two components of metacognition: (1) cognitive conceptions and (2) a cognitive regulation system. The term comes from the root word meta, meaning "beyond", or "on top of". Research has shown that both components of metacognition play key roles in metaconceptual knowledge and learning. Metacognition can take many forms, such as reflecting on one's ways of thinking, and knowing when and how oneself and others use particular strategies for problem-solving.
