

Active Skills For Reading 2

Children begin to learn pre-reading skills at birth while they listen to the speech around them. In order to learn to read, a child must first have knowledge of the oral language. Other terms for reading readiness include early literacy and emergent reading

For educators and researchers, reading is a multifaceted process involving such areas as word recognition, orthography (spelling), alphabets, phonics, phonemic awareness, vocabulary, comprehension, fluency, and motivation.

Gross motor skill The children will typically learn head control, trunk stability, and then standing up and walking. Object control skills would include Gross motor skills are the abilities usually acquired during childhood as part of a child's motor learning. By the time they reach two years of age, almost all children are able to stand up, walk and run, walk up stairs, etc. locomotor skills and object control skills. These skills are built upon, improved and better controlled throughout early childhood, and continue in refinement throughout most of the individual's years of development into adulthood. Gross locomotor skills would include running, jumping, sliding, and swimming. These gross movements come from large muscle groups and whole body movement. These skills develop in a head-to-toe order. It is shown that children exposed to outdoor play time activities will develop better gross motor skills

Some examples are mnemonics, which aid the retention of lists of information; effective reading; concentration techniques; and efficient note taking.

Life skills life skills identified by Collaborative for Academic, Social and Emotional Learning (CASEL). Life skills are a product of synthesis: many skills are developed Life skills are abilities for adaptive and positive behavior that enable humans to deal effectively with the demands and challenges of life. The subject varies greatly depending on social norms and community expectations but skills that function for well-being and aid individuals to develop into active and productive members of their communities are considered as life skills. This concept is also termed as psychosocial competency

Sustained silent reading Sustained silent reading (SSR) is a form of school-based recreational reading, or free voluntary reading, where students read silently in a designated Sustained silent reading (SSR) is a form of school-based recreational reading, or free voluntary reading, where students read silently in a designated period every day, with the underlying assumption being that students learn to read by reading constantly. Despite this, proponents maintain that successful models of SSR typically allow students to select their own books and do not require testing for comprehension or book reports. Schools have implemented SSR under a variety of names, such as "Drop Everything and Read (DEAR)", "Free Uninterrupted Reading (FUR)", or "Uninterrupted sustained silent reading. While classroom implementation of SSR is fairly widespread, some critics note that the data showcasing SSR's effectiveness is insufficient and that SSR alone does not craft proficient readers

Due to the generic nature of study skills, they must, therefore, be distinguished... There is little scientific evidence regarding speed reading, and as a result its value seems uncertain. Cognitive neuroscientist Stanislas Dehaene says that claims of reading up to 1,000 words per minute "must be viewed with skepticism". Other types of reading and writing, such as pictograms (e.g., a hazard symbol and an emoji), are not based on speech-based writing systems. The common link is the interpretation of symbols to extract the meaning from the visual notations or tactile signals (as in the case of braille).

Reading comprehension Comprehension specifically is a "creative, multifaceted process" that is dependent upon four language skills: phonology, syntax, semantics, and pragmatics. word reading and language comprehension. The opposite of reading comprehension is called functional illiteracy. Reading comprehension relies on two abilities that are connected to each other: word reading and language comprehension. Reading comprehension is beyond basic literacy alone, which is the ability to decipher characters and words at all. Comprehension specifically is a "creative,

multifaceted process" that is dependent upon four language skills: phonology Reading comprehension is the ability to process written text, understand its meaning, and to integrate with what the reader already knows. In education it is measured in standardized tests that report which percentile a reader's ability falls. Reading comprehension occurs on a gradient or spectrum, rather than being yes/no (all-or-nothing) 0ee9ebecab

Reading disability Examples of reading disabilities include developmental dyslexia and alexia (acquired dyslexia).
