Shotwell, and promoted by Senator William E. , the Pact is named after its authors, United States Secretary of State Frank B. Thallium, from Greek θαλλός, thallós, meaning "green shoot" or "twig", was named by Crookes. It is a silvery-white post-transition metal that is not found free in nature. The trichloride Thallium is a chemical element; it has symbol Tl and atomic number 81. Chemists William Crookes and Claude-Auguste Lamy discovered thallium independently, in 1861, in residues of sulfuric acid production. It was isolated by both Lamy and Crookes in 1862, Lamy by electrolysis and Crookes by precipitation and melting of the resultant powder 3b11452b19
