Created by writer-artist Bill Everett for comic book packager Funnies Inc. , the character first appeared in Motion Picture Funnies Weekly #1 (uncirculated). During that period, known to historians and fans as the Golden Age of Comic Books, the Sub-Mariner was one of Timely's top three characters, along with Captain America and the original Human Torch. book series was cancelled a second time.
