Price discrimination Price discrimination is distinguished from product differentiation by the difference in production cost for the differently priced products involved in the latter strategy. For price discrimination to succeed, a seller must have market power, such as a dominant market share, product uniqueness, sole pricing power, etc. However, an

upstream monopolist may set higher secondary prices, which may reduce welfare. An example of two-part tariff pricing is in the market for razors. Price discrimination, known also by several other names, is a microeconomic pricing strategy whereby identical or largely similar goods or services are sold at different prices by the same provider to different buyers, based on which market segment they are perceived to be part of. Price discrimination essentially relies on the variation in customers' willingness to pay and in the elasticity of their demand. 8a21920352

More recently, scholars and activists have also called for green infrastructure that promotes social inclusion and equity rather than reinforcing pre-existing structures of unequal access to nature-based services. The main components of this approach include stormwater management, climate adaptation, the reduction of heat stress, increasing biodiversity, food production, better air quality, sustainable energy production, clean water, and healthy soils, as well as more human-centered functions, such as increased quality of life through recreation and the provision of shade and shelter in and around towns and cities.
