Oscar Wilde Wilde is best known for his Gothic novel The Picture of Dorian Gray (1890), his epigrams, plays, and bedtime stories for children, as well as his criminal conviction in 1895 for gross indecency for homosexual acts. After writing in different literary styles throughout the 1880s, he became one of the most popular and influential dramatists in London in the early 1890s. He was a key figure in the emerging Aestheticism movement of the late 19th century and is regarded by many as the greatest playwright of the Victorian era. Wilde is best known for his Gothic novel The Picture of Dorian Gray (1890), his epigrams, plays, and bedtime stories for children, as Oscar Fingal O'Flahertie Wills Wilde (16 October 1854 – 30 November 1900) was an Irish author, poet, and playwright. the Victorian era 024053cd1c

" In ancient times, it might refer more broadly to a description of any thing, person, or experience. paints a picture of the young man named Dorian Gray. Thus, "an ekphrastic poem is a vivid description of a scene or, more commonly, a work of art. It is a vivid, often dramatic, verbal description of a visual work of art, either real or imagined. Dorian meets Lord Henry Wotton, who espouses a new hedonism, dedicated to the pursuit of beauty and Ekphrasis or ecphrasis (from the Greek) is a rhetorical device indicating the written description of a work of art 024053cd1c

The first work to be labelled as Gothic was Horace Walpole's 1764 novel The Castle of Otranto, later subtitled A Gothic Story.
