Special education In the United States a part-time alternative that is appropriate for Special education (also known as special-needs education, aided education, alternative provision, exceptional student education, special ed. States, a one-on-one aide for a student with a disability is called a paraprofessional. , SDC, and SPED) is the practice of educating students in a way that accommodates their individual differences, disabilities, and special needs. This involves the individually planned and systematically monitored arrangement of teaching procedures, adapted equipment and materials, and accessible settings. These interventions are designed to help individuals with special needs achieve a higher level of personal self-sufficiency and success in school and in their community, which may not be available if the student were only given access to a typical classroom education a46ea6cf0c

This person is called also called an aide, paraeducator Inclusive classroom is a term used within American pedagogy to describe a classroom in which all students, irrespective of their abilities or skills, are welcomed holistically.
