cooperation, rationality, discernment and so on – that informs how life should be lived, and that awareness of sin does not require special revelation. Rationality This quality can apply to an ability, as in a rational animal, to a psychological process, like reasoning, to mental states, such as beliefs and intentions, or to persons who possess these other forms of rationality. It is relevant to and discussed in many disciplines. In ethics, one question is whether one can be rational without being moral at the same time. **Psychology** Rationality is the quality of being guided by or based on reason. In this regard, a person acts rationally if they have a good reason for what they do, or a belief is rational if it is based on strong evidence. A thing that lacks rationality is either arational, if it is outside the domain of rational evaluation, or irrational, if it belongs to this domain but does not fulfill its standards d61d9c1f6d

Deontology Deontological ethics is commonly contrasted to utilitarianism and other consequentialist theories, virtue ethics, and pragmatic ethics. In the deontological approach, the inherent rightfulness of actions is considered more important than their consequences. It is sometimes described as duty-, obligation-, or rule-based ethics. According to Kant's account, "ordinary moral reasoning is fundamentally Kantian ethics refers to a deontological ethical theory developed by German philosopher Immanuel Kant that is based on the notion that "I ought never to act except in such a way that I could also will that my maxim should become a universal law. It states that an action can only be moral if it is motivated by a sense of duty, and its maxim may be rationally willed a universal, objective law

Kant formulated the categorical imperative in various ways. Contemporary philosophy theory and practice, and tend to see their philosophical inquiries as closely related to personal, moral, or political transformation. The phrase is often confused with modern philosophy (which refers to an earlier period in Western philosophy), postmodern philosophy (which refers to some philosophers' criticisms

of modern philosophy), and with a non-technical use of the phrase referring to any recent philosophic work.
