The Dynamics of Language (2005) by Ronnie Cann, Ruth Kempson and Lutz Dynamic Syntax (DS) is a grammar formalism and linguistic theory whose overall aim is to explain the real-time processes of language understanding and production, and describe linguistic structures as happening step-by-step over time. While it posits representations similar to those used in Combinatory categorial grammars (CCG), it builds those representations left-to-right going word-by-word. Under the DS approach, syntactic knowledge is understood as the ability to incrementally analyse the structure and content of spoken and written language in context and in real-time. They describe these circumstances using abstract mathematical models to represent entities and their features. The principle of compositionality helps them link the meaning of expressions to abstract objects in these models. Formal semanticists rely on diverse methods to analyze natural language. It is an interdisciplinary field, sometimes regarded as a subfield of both linguistics and philosophy of language.
