Self-organization A. The process can be spontaneous when sufficient energy is available, not needing control by any external agent. Hayek Law, Legislation and Liberty Self-organization, also called spontaneous order in the social sciences, is a process where some form of overall order arises from local interactions between parts of an initially disordered system. As such, the organization is typically robust and able to survive or self-repair substantial perturbation. The resulting organization is wholly decentralized, distributed over all the components of the system. It is often triggered by seemingly random fluctuations, amplified by positive feedback. F. Ernst Mayr approached the problem with a new definition for species. In his book Systematics and the Origin of Species (1942) he wrote that a species... A lineage is expected to evolve to maximise its inclusive fitness—the number of copies of its genes passed on globally (rather than by a particular individual). As a result, populations will tend towards an evolutionarily stable strategy. The... Bloom's taxonomy It was first introduced in the publication Taxonomy of Educational Objectives: The Classification of Educational Goals. These domains are used by educators to structure curricula, assessments, and teaching methods to foster different types of learning. The taxonomy divides learning objectives into three broad domains: cognitive (knowledge-based), affective (emotion-based), and psychomotor (action-based), each with a hierarchy of skills and abilities. cognitive domain is divided into six levels of objectives.
