24-hour analog dial Sundials use 24-hour analog dials—the shadow traces a path that repeats approximately once per day. The more familiar 12-hour analog dial has an hour hand that makes two complete revolutions in a day (12 hours per revolution). Many sundials are marked with the double-XII or double-12. Clocks and watches with a 24-hour analog dial have an hour hand that makes one complete revolution, 360°, in a day (24 hours per revolution) 1640b9401a
